School Attendance and Illness

Excellent school attendance is essential to ensure your child doesn't miss out on key learning. With the cold and flu season upon us, we thought it would be helpful to share some key information.

When is my child too ill for school?

Reporting Absence

If your child is unwell or unable to attend school, please **contact the school office by 9.15am** to let us know.

If your child is not registered that morning and we have not heard from you by 9.30am, we have a safeguarding duty of care to contact you and the other individuals listed on your child's profile.

In cases where we are unable to reach anyone, we are required to carry out a welfare check to ensure your child's safety and wellbeing.

Walking Bus

Please make sure you are there to meet your child at their stop.

Consent forms are available from the school office and must be completed before your child can take part.

Parents are also welcome to use the bus on an ad hoc basis, as and when needed.
